**PROCEEDINGS OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL
OF THE TOWN OF BERWICK, STATE OF LOUISIANA
TAKEN AT A SPECIAL MEETING HELD ON TUESDAY**

January 28, 2014

The Mayor and Council of the Town of Berwick, State of Louisiana, met in special session at their regular meeting place, the Town Hall, Berwick, Louisiana, Tuesday, January 28 2014, at eight thirty (8:30) o'clock a.m.

There were present: Council members Duval Arthur, Troy Lombardo, Greg Roussel, Damon Robison and Edgar Thomas.

Absent: None

Mayor Louis Ratcliff led the prayer.

Mayor Pro-Tem Duval Arthur led the Pledge of Allegiance.

The Mayor and Council of the Town of Berwick, State of Louisiana were duly convened as the governing authority of said Town, by the Honorable Louis Ratcliff, Mayor, who then stated that the Mayor and Council were ready for the transaction of business.

Each councilman waived the right of notification of the special meeting.

Item #1 on agenda – Ordinance No. 652/Resolution No. 15-14 – Declaration of Emergency due to inclement weather. Upon motion by Edgar Thomas and seconded by Troy Lombardo, the ordinance/resolution was approved by unanimous voice vote.

Item #2 on the agenda – Any other new business – There was no other business.

Councilman Lombardo asked Police Chief Richard if there were plans to impose a curfew on town residents and the chief stated that there was not a curfew planned at this time. Mayor Pro-Tem Duval Arthur stated that the St. Mary Parish Emergency Declaration contained language that would allow him to call for a parish wide curfew, but it was not planned at this time. Town Attorney Allen McElroy stated that the Berwick Water Plant would have to declare an emergency, if needed.

There being no further business to come before the Council, upon motion by Duval Arthur and seconded by Troy Lombardo, the meeting adjourned.
